

Ecotourism Society of India and Madhya Pradesh Tourism supported by the Ministry of Tourism, Government of India jointly hosted Bhopal International Conference on Sustainable Tourism (BICST 2013) from 18th to 19th April 2013.

Inaugurated by Mr. R. Parasuram, Chief Secretary, Madhya Pradesh, during the two-day conference, 28 international and national speakers shared their experiences and ideas on the topic "Tourism: Enabler for Conservation, Livelihood and Sustainable Growth" with 150 national and international delegates.

Background to BICST 2013

Ecotourism in India is a fledgling sector which has immense potential for growth and providing employment to the rural population.

While there have been some encouraging progress in the ecotourism sector in India with Ministry of Tourism rolling out Sustainable Tourism Criteria of India (STCI) for accommodation providers and tour operators in April 2013, there have also been some setbacks like the Supreme Court of India banning Tiger Tourism for a brief period in 2012 before the Government of India promulgated guidelines on Tiger Conservation and Tourism in and around Tiger Reserves.

The National Tiger Conservation Authority's (NTCA) comprehensive

guidelines on tiger conservation and tourism focus on eventually converting all tourism inside Protected Areas (PAs) into ecotourism. The guidelines mandate developing the buffer areas so as to ease tourism related pressures from the core areas.

The buffer areas need to be developed with a focus on making them analogous to core areas in terms of wildlife presence. The management challenges of these non-Protected Areas need to be addressed with and a possibility of partnerships with the private industry to step in and develop these areas. These options need to be explored.

In this context, BICST 2013 was organized with a strong focus on highlighting and promoting ecotourism's role in sustainable development.

<u>Creating a Common Platform for all</u> Stakeholders

The aim of BICST 2013 was to come up with a meaningful conceptualization of ecotourism that meets policy requirements, reflects existing ground realities and strikes a balance between conservation, tourism and local livelihoods. To achieve this, the conference facilitated deliberations among international experts, policy-makers from the Government of India and State governments, academics, NGOs and representatives of communities currently engaged in tourism.

The conference shall become an annual affair that focuses on the advancement of sustainability goals for the tourism industry and offers an opportunity for

stakeholders to discuss ideas and solutions that inspire change.

Wide Range of Challenges and Opportunities for Ecotourism in India

The technical sessions of the two-day conference looked at international best practices of multi-stakeholder involvement as well as the national level ecotourism framework in India and comprised the following topics:

- Ecotourism Solutions and Strategies: Reflections on Global Experiences
- Ecotourism Framework in India: Law, Policy and Politics
- Ecotourism Framework in India: Stakeholder Experiences of Challenges and Opportunities
- Ecotourism Framework in India:
 Exploring Potential for Stakeholder's
 Collaboration in Madhya Pradesh

Additional, interesting inputs were given by discussions and multi-stakeholder dialogue on exploring potential for stakeholder's collaboration in Madhya Pradesh.
